

Bill Staples elected to Emeritus status

His face could easily remind you of that favorite uncle whom everyone loves and admires. His demeanor is that of a person on the mission of a lifetime. and his repertoire of service speaks to this. Bill Staples has engaged in this mission for the past three decades through neighborhood based organizations including the Near North Preservation Coalition, the Green Lake Conservancy Foundation, the 1540 Lake Shore Drive Co-Op, and Columbia College's Museum of Contemporary Photography. Their diversity reflects his passions and commitment. After 26 years of service to the Gold Coast Neighbors Association we might say, mission accomplished.

Bill Staples moved into the Gold Coast neighborhood with his wife Margie decades ago and has not missed an air show since. The Gold Coast was a natural choice for Bill and Margie as they are avid dog-lovers with a special love for Lakeland Terriers and their newest addition "Heather." Their summer home on Green Lake, WI has become a quiet retreat from the city, where they enjoy their boat and the intellectually challenging entertainment of Par puzzles.

In the 1980's, Bill was pursued by the neighborhood's social advocate, Mary Lou Maher, who recruited him to be a voice for the zoning issues of concern. He joined the Gold Coast Neighbors Association as director in 1985 after a high-rise threatened to block precious views and diminish the quality of life for many neighbors. Consequently, in the early nineties, Bill labored to collect 2,000 petitions and approached the courts asking for "no more high-rises" in the Gold Coast. The results have been profound as 1418 Lake Shore Drive is the last building to touch the skies over the Gold Coast. It should come as no surprise that Bill's energy and focus led to his natural leadership of GCNA as president from 1997-2000. (continued on next page)

Since then, Bill Staples has worked on many other zoning issues, all focused on providing a safer neighborhood for all you morning runners and walkers. Pedestrians and cars alike have seen drastic improvement when the underpass at North Avenue was rebuilt and no longer floods with eight feet of rain water. He also galvanized the collective voice of the GCN members to petition the alderman for the city to install a stoplight at Burton Street, on Lake Shore Drive. Consequently, there have been no accidents since.

Bill has been instrumental in the yearly planning and coordinating of the Gold Coast Neighbors Association's largest fundraising event each year, "Evening on Astor". He greatly enjoys what is now known as "the world's most elegant block party" as it helps create neighborly community and fund all that has been and will be accomplished by the association.

Some might say Bill Staple's most notable accomplishment came in the early nineties when the association faced tough legal issues. Bill used his corporate finance and investments background, honed and practiced daily at his namesake firm, to stabilize GCN and get it back on solid footing.

Among many accomplishments, Bill is particularly proud of leading GCN to be connected with the broader community. He gathered and donated a large sum of money to policemen who were out of a job and raised funds to provide a new kitchen for firefighters who have not traditionally seen city support for this need. It is his desire that we continue to engage in collective outreach for less-advantaged individuals in our community.

When asked where Bill would like to see Gold Coast Neighbors Association grow in the future, he spoke to the need for more pressure on zoning to ensure quality of life, and more petitions around CAPS (Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy) which encourages community members and police to work together to reduce the occurrence of crimes. Most importantly, Bill would like to see the fine organization, North Dearborn Association, and Gold Coast Neighbors Association merge to reduce confusion among neighbors and to speak with a strong singular-voice to our aldermen.

Bill would also like to encourage those considering involvement to join in and jump on a committee. Be a voice and activist for change, safety, preservation and beautification of our wonderful neighborhood. If you take interest in your neighborhood and finally say "I'm going to do something about it", then you can be a part of change that is very fulfilling.

Bill Staple's passion and service to the Gold Coast Neighborhood Association is one that is matched by few, so he raises the bar for all who take part in such a rewarding experience as serving our neighbors. After such a successful term of director leadership, and his service as president from 1997 -2000, Bill is now transitioning to Director Emeritus. The term "Emeritus" originated in the mid-18th century from Latin. As the past participle of Emereri, it denotes "earning one's discharge by service." This term has come to be used when a person of great importance in a given role or profession hands over his position. Bill Staples is that person. His years of service and investment in GCN has produced a first rate organization. Many have benefited from his vast knowledge and patient counsel again and again. Though Bill Staples will no longer sit on the board of directors, he will remain a true "Emeritus"; one who will hold the rich history of the Gold Coast and its seasons of change very near and dear for many years to come.

Report from CAPS Meeting held on March 8, 2011 - Jim Kinoshita

- Permit Parking Discussion around permit parking, as people were seeking 24 hour permit
 parking between the 1200 to 1600 blocks of Astor and State. This request should be made
 through their respective aldermen who will request a CDOT survey.
- Summer The influx of unruly beach-goers this year is being anticipated. Rather than being caught off-guard:
 - Extra details will be assigned
 - Patrol will be beefed up
 - o More cameras will be installed on the streets, beach, and around the neighborhood
- Theft Mobs recent smash and grab robberies on Michigan Avenue. These people were
 using the internet, Twitter and Facebook to set up theft meetings. The police made 7 arrests
 on 2/19 and from these 15 additional arrests. The police are also better monitoring the
 internet.
- No real mention of the new mayor or police chief and the corresponding changes/ ramifications. This will be addressed in upcoming CAPS meetings.
- Summer the police want neighbors to be cognizant that theft increases in the summer months.
- Block Clubs if neighbors/neighborhoods want to come together and address problems and work on solutions, the police would like offer certified trainers to assist in the process.
- Next meetings: May 10th and July 12th, both at the Ambassador East at 7 p.m.
